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# THE RELEVANCE OF TEACHING METHODS AND TECHNIQUES AND THE PROBLEMS OF INTRODUCING INNOVATIVE TEACHING METHODS

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#### **Abstract**:

This article is devoted to the analysis of the problems of the process of updating methods and methods of teaching and the introduction of innovative teaching methods in the education system of Uzbekistan. Also, one of the important documents is the decree "On measures to improve the quality of education and ensure its competitiveness at the international level", adopted on May 12, 2021 to improve the quality of education in Uzbekistan at all stages from preschool to higher education. [3] The decree raised the issues of modernizing the educational process through the use of new pedagogical approaches in education, the widespread introduction of innovative and interactive methods.

Although there are problems in the process of reforming the education system, such as the lack of technical resources and qualified personnel, the training of teachers in a new way, the measures taken by the state are aimed at eliminating these shortcomings. Therefore, the practical introduction of modern teaching methods plays an important role in increasing the competitiveness of the education system of Uzbekistan.

In this article, the changes that have taken place in recent years in the field of education on a global scale require a rethinking of teaching methods.
